First Year Advising Center

- Opened in Fall 2012
- Intrusive advising utilizing caseload advising model
- Improved and sustained retention rates
- Full-time Freshman retention fall 2011 vs. 2013
 - Minority students up 10%
 - Undecided students up 17%
 - Housing students up 12%
 - Students ending first year with sophomore status up 11%



Supplemental Instruction

- Typically offered in high DFWI courses
- 88 sections scheduled for FY16
- Students attending 15 or more S.I. sessions end the semester with grades of up to 1.2 (most .5 to .75) higher than students who don't attend



Tutoring

- Offered for most 100 and 200 level courses
- No cost to students
- Tutors are OU students who have successfully completed the course
- Tutors are credentialed by CRLA
- Tutors report being better students as a result of tutoring experience

- Direct feedback from faculty to individual student(s)
- Easily accessible in BANNER under Faculty Services in SAIL
- Open for the first 8 weeks of the semester
- Watch for rollout including tutorial videos and CETL Program(s)
- Merges the M.S.E. and Early Alert roles



Oakland 8

- 4 Student Affairs and 4 Academic Affairs partners participated in John Gardner's Institute for Student Success in 2013 and 2015
- Focus on Gateway Courses, retention and graduation
 - Ex. Psych 100
- Recognition that what occurs in the first year determines a student's chances for success
- Recall Oakland's historical participation in the Foundations of Excellence



Career Services

- Career Services professional serves as a liaison to each professional school and the College
- Promotes relationships between employers and students for internship and co-op opportunities
