20 Years of Teaching Knowledge in 7 Questions

Anthony Tuf Francis, Oakland University's 2016 Teaching Excellence Award recipient and Assistant Professor of Teacher Development and Educational Studies, shares what he has learned about teaching through seven questions.

How effectively do you utilize class time?

Students should not feel that any class moment is a waste of time. They must see the value.

How much do you care about the experience students have in your class?

Collect student feedback often, from course reviews to personal communication, to show you care.

How often do you reform your class?

Resist getting too comfortable with your class structure, even at the risk of making mistakes.

How "open" is your door to student needs?

Consider how you restrict or show openness to students, and how to keep in touch with students.

Are you more concerned with LEARNING or DETAILS?

Focus on students' understanding the course material rather than only your discipline.

How interested are you in students' OVERALL experience in your department?

Beyond your class, commit to optimizing students' learning within their discipline.

Are you concerned with the way students are operationalizing the content from your course?

Work with colleagues to ensure students have a cohesive growth of knowledge in their courses.
