

BOARD CERTIFIED ASSISTANT BEHAVIOR ANALYST

(BCaBA) Coursework

Oakland University's BCaBA course sequence, approved by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB), fulfills course requirements for the BCaBA credential. BCaBA certification requires a minimum of a bachelor's degree from an accredited university, completion of an approved series of courses, and a defined period of supervised practical experience, in order to apply for the BCaBA examination. Applicants must meet all eligibility requirements, apply for the credential, and pass the BCaBA examination to become certified at the BCaBA level.

COURSEWORK OVERVIEW

- All courses will be taught by a BCBA or BCBA-D
- 4 courses are required, offered over 12 months (beginning in Fall semester)
- Courses will be held on the campus of Oakland University from 5:30-8:50 pm:
 - Fall 2018 | Wednesdays
 - Winter 2019 | Mondays and Wednesdays
 - Summer 2019 | Wednesdays
- Tuition rates: oakland.edu/tuition
 - Undergraduate students - 2018-19 Upper Division Rate (16 credits)
 - Post-bachelor student rate: \$700 per course (non-credit)
