Traditional - Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Program Description

Oakland University's (OU) School of Nursing (SON) undergraduate program offers a - Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) track. Graduates of the Traditional-BSN track are eligible to take the National Council Licensing Examination-Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN). There are two admission cycles for the Traditional-BSN track each year (fall and winter semester).

The nursing has a two-step application process

Step 1: Admission to Oakland University Admission to OU is required to be eligible for admission to the Traditional-BSN track. Contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at (248) 370-3360 for information or apply online at oakland.edu/apply.

Step 2: Admission to the School of Nursing Students may gain admission to the Traditional-BSN track by, direct admission or competitive admission.

Direct Admission

Direct admission to the Traditional-BSN track is designed for high-achieving high school students intending to major in nursing.

Direct Admission Requirements

For consideration for direct admission to the School of Nursing, apply to Oakland University with a major of Pre-Nursing by November 1 of the applicant's senior year in high school and satisfy the following:

- Re-calculated high school grade point average (GPA) of 3.5 or higher
- At least one year of high school biology and one year of high school chemistry completed prior to the senior year with a final course grade of B or better in each course.
- Composite SAT score of 1160 or ACT score of 24 in each of the following: Math, English, Reading, and Science.

Note that completion of minimum requirements does not guarantee an offer of direct admission. The admissions application is the only application that is needed. Also, Grade Point Average and test scores carry weight in the decision process.

Competitive Admission

The SON offers competitive entry to the BSN for the Fall and Winter semesters. At least 71 students are admitted in the fall and 96 students in the winter. To be considered for admissions,

- Complete the five science courses (listed in gold) with a final course grade of B or higher in each course.
- Attain an overall prerequisite GPA in these courses of 3.2 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Complete PHL (1000, 1100 or 1300), MTH 0661 if needed and, WRT 1060 with a final course grade of B or higher.

- * Pre Nursing GPA: Admission into the Nursing program is based on 5 science courses with the * in the prerequisites section.
- ¹ MTH 0661: requirement will be waived with an ACT math score of 18 or higher or SAT math score of 490 or higher (440 if taken prior to March 2016).
- ² WRT 1060: course will be waived with an ACT writing score of 28 or higher or SAT writing score of 620 or higher. WRT 1050 is a prerequisite course for WRT 1060. WRT 1050 course will be waived with an ACT writing score of 18 or higher or SAT writing score of 410 or higher.

Completion of the minimum competitive admission Requirements does not guarantee admission to the Traditional-BSN track

Note that competitive admission applicants must be in good academic standing at OU to apply. Preference for Competitive Admission to the Traditional-BSN track is given to students who have completed five or more of the prerequisite courses (excluding MTH 0661) at OU. Refer to catalog.oakland.edu for more information.

Transfer Equivalency Grades

Competitive admission applicants who take any of the pre-requisite courses at an academic institution other than OU will have their transcripts evaluated for equivalency. Final course grades for courses taken at another academic institution do not appear on the OU transcript. However, for the purposes of admission to the Traditional-BSN track, grades are converted as follows:

Repeating Courses

Students may repeat prerequisite courses. Please refer to the Oakland University Catalog for information on repeating courses.

<u>Application Deadlines Dates</u>

To be consider for admissions all pre-requisite courses must be completed before June 1 for Fall and October 1st for Winter. Visit oakland.edu/nursing for more information.
