John Struck has taught high school for 32 years, 29 of those years teaching advanced placement U.S. history; and has been working at the Thomas Jefferson High School for Science and Technology in Fairfax County, VA for 22 years. Mr. Struck has led day-long workshops in the Southern, Midwest, and Southwest Regions and in Shanghai, China since 2002 and has taught 33 week-long summer institute workshops over the past ten years in the Southern and Midwest Regions. Along with teaching and leading workshops, Mr. Struck has been a reader for the AP US history exam since 1999 and now serves as a table leader, he piloted a field test for the redesigned exam format, and has written US history curriculum on the local, state, and national levels. Mr. Struck is a member of the Society of Historians of the Early American Republic and the Calvin Coolidge Memorial Foundation. In 2014 Mr. Struck was named Gilder-Lehrman U.S. history Teacher of the Year for the state of Virginia and also recognized in 2015 by the University of Chicago as an "Outstanding Educator."
