Radiologic technologists are responsible for administering ionizing radiation to patients for diagnostic or research purposes. The primary responsibility of the radiologic technologist is to integrate advanced radiographic techniques and positioning with applied knowledge of anatomy and physiology for the imaging of internal structures. Practitioners of radiologic technology must possess qualities such as good communication and a desire to work directly with patients.

The Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Technology is <u>accredited</u> by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT).

Students must have a minimum cumulative transfer GPA of 2.8 in order to be admitted to the Clinical Diagnostic Sciences curriculum, and admission into the internship in order to add any specializations. Acceptance into the internship programs is competitive and is based on grade point average, personal interview and letters of recommendation.

Oakland University will always honor the **MACRAO transfer agreement** and apply it to the General Education requirement the same as MTA.
