Classes under the HS rubric that are included in the major requirements CANNOT double count towards Health Promotion Track.</i></p>			

All courses in this track must be approved by the program director. Certain minors and graduate programs have specific GPA requirements. Consult with an adviser for additional information.

-  Major requires all courses completed, a minimum of 130 credits required and completion of all university requirements for the degree.
-  Minimum of 32 credits at the 3000(300) or 4000(400) level are required for graduation

-  Meet with an academic adviser in the School of Health Sciences before registering for classes
