## 2013-14 Report of Activities of Academic Computing Committee (ACC)

## **Projects completed:**

- Approval of Moodle Policy: The ACC reviewed and approved the new Moodle Policy developed by ELIS.
- **Proctoring Center Survey:** The ACC reviewed the survey designed by John Coughlin and Shaun Moore to assess the need for a proctoring center on campus. The survey is ready and will be launched shortly.
- Proctoring Procedures: The ACC reviewed the proctoring procedures developed by John Coughlin and provided feedback to optimize their implementation.
- **Technology How To Library:** The ACC explored the possibility of developing a series of instructional videos on how to use technology in the classroom. This project is currently being undertaken by CETL.
- Instructional Fair: The ACC approached the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (CETL) to collaborate with them on the organization of the 2014 Instructional Fair. The ACC was particularly interested in showcasing best practices in computer assisted instruction as well as other instructional uses of technology across campus. CETL has decided combine the Instructional Fair and the Teaching and Learning Conference.
- Software Purchase Criteria: The ACC is currently discussing a set of criteria to prioritize the purchase of software site licenses. We expect to have these criteria ready before the end of the Winter 2014 semester.
- Approval of 2013-14 Software Licenses Purchases: The ACC reviewed and approved software license purchases for the 2013-14 academic year.
- Review of Strategic Plan for IT: The ACC reviewed and commented on the status of projects within the Strategic Plan for IT

## **Information Gathering Projects:**

The ACC has also worked on gathering information on a series of issues that affect academic computing policy, but on which no resolution or specific action has been taken. These issues are:
