Subject: Report of the Committee for 1964-1965

During the past year the Committee considered the question of intercollegiate athletics at Oakland from the specifics of the pros and cons of basketball to the general approach of a set of regulations within which any intercollegiate sport could operate effectively without detriment to the academic standards of the University. Since quantitative evaluation of the first approach, as applied to a given sport proved impossible, the latter approach was followed. The results of these deliberations are summarized in the enclosed memorandum and attached document with specific recommendations for regulation of sports at Oakland.

MEMORANDUM

TO: The Academic Senate

FROM: The Athletic Policy Committee

The Athletic Policy Committee submits to the Senate the following recommendations concerning the Intercollegiate Sports Program. It is our belief that these regulations constitute a framework within which a sports program can operate effectively and without detriment to the academic standards of the University.

In this belief we further recommend that, if the Senate sees fit to adopt these regulations, basket-ball be given not less than a three-year trial period in the Intercollegiate Sports Program. At the end of that time the Senate may review the conduct of this sport (or any other) and re-examine the question of its place in the Oakland Intercollegiate Sports Program.
