PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In this graduate certificate program students will develop specialized data-management skills as they apply what they learn about data mining, artificial intelligence, block chain, cryptocurrencies, deep learning, machine learning and text analytics to key financial scenarios, including the creation and dynamic implementation of budgets, capital budgeting, valuation, capital structure and derivatives. Special topics may cover mergers and acquisitions, international financial issues and bankruptcy prediction.

This certificate program is especially useful for students with an interest in commercial and investment banking, including regulatory applications such as value at risk and expected shortfall.

MIS 5560 Introduction to Data Science In this course, students gain an understanding of machine learning models.

MIS 6900 Special Topics: Foundations of AI and FinTech Applications

This course covers the fundamental building blocks of fintech applications. Topics include artificial intelligence, deep learning, blockchain, smart contracts, big data and cryptocurrency.

- November 15 for the winter semester (September 1 for international students)
- March 1 for the summer semester (January 1 for international students)
