#### **MINUTES**

- 1. Committee approved of Minutes #2, December 5, 2016.
- 2. Committee deferred the request from the Department of Biological Sciences to **add** the following *new courses*:

BIO 586/5012 Experimental Design and Analysis (4)
Design and analysis of manipulative and natural experiments, emphasizing the practical use of statistics for analyzing common types of data in the biological sciences. Topics will include

generalized linear models, model selection, mixed models, survival analysis and randomization tests.

3. Committee approved the request from the Department of Writing and Rhetoric to add the following new course:

WRT 5900 Special Topics in Writing and Rhetoric (1-4) Special topics in the teaching of college writing, writing for digital media, and professional writing. Can be repeated for a total of 18 credits.

4. Committee approved the request from the Department of Chemistry to make the following *changes* to **catalog copy**:

Application requirements

To be considered for graduate admission, applicants must submit all Graduate Application Requirements and additional department requirements by the published application deadlines:

- 1. Graduate Application Requirements
- 2. Additional department application requirements
  - Two essays MPA essay (Forms Instructions are downloadable from http://www.oakland.edu/mpa.)
  - Applicants should have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or greater in their undergraduate degree.

For the **Post-Master's Graduate Certificate in Health Care Administration**, add the following courses to the electives options:

PA 503 – Intergovernmental Relations (4 credits) PA 657 – Workshop in Budgeting (2 credits)

#### 4 + 1 B.S. to M.P.A.

To be eligible for the 4 + 1 B.S. to M.P.A. option, students must

have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.2 or higher; completed at least six classes of the undergraduate program major courses; and earned a minimum 3.0 grade in the following two courses:

- PS 351 Public Administration Financial Analysis
- PS 353 American Public Policy.

Apply for and receive *delayed admission* to the M.P.A. program in order to substitute the graduate courses PA 501, PA 553, and PA 554 for three undergraduate courses, PS 350, PS 353, and PS 354.

Note: Students must receive formal acceptance delayed admission into the M.P.A. program to be eligible to register for PA 501, PA 553, and PA 554.
