2017 Oakland University Climate Survey

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Methods

This report summarizes the results of the climate survey conducted by the Office of the Senior Advisor to the President for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion and the Office of Inclusion at Oakland University under the direction of the Office of the President. The survey aimed to assess perceptions of the work and academic climate at Oakland University among faculty, staff, and students at Oakland University. The University of Illinois Survey Research Laboratory (SRL) assisted with the survey.

SRL personnel assisted in questionnaire development, programmed the Web survey instruments, managed the online data collection process, and conducted data analysis. Three separate questionnaires were prepared, one for each stratum of respondents: faculty, staff, and students. All questionnaires were designed to collect feedback about participants' perceptions of the work and academic climate at the university, including inclusiveness, friendliness, cooperation, professionalism, recognition, support, and opportunities for career advancement/academic success. Respondents also answered a few questions about themselves. The final student questionnaire is presented in Appendix D.

Approval for the study protocol was sought from the University at Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) IRB, who approved it (under exempt protocol #17196) on September 28, 2016.

Data were collected primarily by means of an online survey. All faculty, staff, and students on the main campus and at other locations of Oakland University were sent an e-mail inviting them to participate in the survey (see Appendix C for text of the e-mail invitation). Initial e-mail invitations were sent by SRL on February 28 and March 1, 2017. Three e-mails reminding non-respondents to take part in the study were sent on March 7, 15, and 23, respectively. The survey was closed to responses on March 30, 2017.

Emails were sent out to 22,022 potential respondents including 1,605 faculty, 1,793 staff, and 18,624 students. Of these, 2,666 completed the questionnaire, broken out by category as follows: 407 faculty, 525 staff, and 1,734 students. Table 1 presents the response rate for the respondents who completed the questionnaire. Based on the numbers available for the total number of respondents to whom the initial emails were sent, the overall response rate is 12.1%. The response rate varied from a low of 9.3% among students to a high of 29.3% among staff (see Table 1).

Organization of the Reports

The Oakland University Climate Survey gathered information from faculty, staff, and students on the main campus and at other Oakland locations. The analysis and reports are stratified by University role: (1) all faculty, (2) all staff, and (3) all students.

The reports provide background information on the method used to collect data, the overall approach to data analysis, computation of the measures, how to interpret the means, how to assess statistical significance,

and charts and tables of results. Each report also includes appendices containing the survey instrument used, text of invitation and reminder e-mails, and detailed tables on individual questions in the questionnaire.

Overall Approach to the Analysis of the Data

The climate survey collected data from 2,666 faculty, students, and staff. Each of the three questionnaires included over 50 questions, resulting in over 200 total variables in the data file. Presenting tables or graphs of all items in the questionnaire would result in an unwieldy amount of information from which it would be difficult to discern key findings. One of the challenges in analyzing the data was to organize the results in a way that included as much information as possible without overwhelming the reader with data. Our strategy for meeting this challenge is as follows: construct a measure that captures the perception of students on the overall climate at Oakland University, conduct principal components analysis to group the other questionnaire items into groups known as *principal components*, conduct regression analysis to understand how these components relate to or explain variation in perceptions of overall climate, prioritize components based on their relationship with overall climate and the mean ratings given to them by students, and assess whether there are any variations in these components based on student demographics.

Computing the Outcome Variable: Overall Climate

First, we computed a measure that would capture the perception of students on the overall work climate at Oakland University; this is the outcome variable of interest. It was created based on our judgment about which questions best capture respondent opinion of the overall university climate. For students, the items that best capture overall outcome are ones that ask about overall climate and recommendation of Oakland to other students:

- Overall, how would you rate the climate on the campus where you are primarily located?
- Overall, how strongly would you recommend Oakland University to other students?

We averaged the ratings given by students to these two items to create a single outcome variable, which we will call "overall climate."

Principal Components Analysis

Next, we turned our attention to the questionnaire items asking about various aspects of the academic climate for students, including perceptions of diversity, fairness of treatment, academic support and physical safety on campus, among others. To reduce the number of explanatory variables while retaining as much information as possible, we employed a standard data reduction technique known as *principal components analysis*: individual items are sorted into groups known as *principal components*, based on their correlations with each other. Items grouped into one component will have higher correlations with each other than with items not included in that component. While there is no specific theory guiding the procedure—that is, there is no prior expectation about which items should group together—the resulting components are usually substantively meaningful. In other words, we would expect two items related to physical safety to be part of the same component; we would not expect items regarding issues as disparate as safety, academics, and friendliness to all belong to the same component.

Computing Explanatory Variables

In the 2013 Oakland Climate Survey, our approach to creating the explanatory components for these reports included four steps:

- Conducting principal components analysis for the five-point rating scale items.
- Inspecting the output to determine whether the results are substantively meaningful.
- If necessary, making adjustments to the components (based on component "loadings"—the strength of the relationship between the overall component and the individual items in that component).
- Once the final components were identified, computing a score for each component, which is the mean of all items belonging to that component.

For the 2017 Oakland Climate Survey, we are using the same components as in 2013, with some minor changes to take into account changes in the questionnaire between the two years. The score for each component is the mean of all items in the component.

Regression Analysis

After computing the components, we conducted a regression analysis in which the outcome variable—overall climate—was regressed on the explanatory components. Regression analysis helps to understand the relationship between the outcome variable—overall climate—and the explanatory variables—specific aspects of climate. The relationship can be expressed in terms of a standardized regression coefficient, which can range from –1.0 to 1.0. The sign of the coefficient indicates the direction of the relationship: a negative coefficient indicates that the outcome variable and the explanatory variable are inversely related—as one increases, the other decreases; a positive coefficient means that as one variable increases, so does the other. The size of the coefficient indicates the strength of the relationship, while controlling for all other variables in the regression: the closer the correlation is to –1.0 or 1.0, the stronger the relationship.

Prioritizing Explanatory Variables

Thereafter, we used the following procedures to determine the order of relevance for the explanatory variables:

- Examine the regression coefficient between the explanatory variables and the outcome variable (i.e., overall climate).
- Present the results in order of the explanatory variables' association with the outcome variable, in order
 of decreasing strength of association.

The data in this report are presented as a series of grids for specific components, analyzed by background characteristics of the respondents. The appendices include frequencies for all closed-ended items in the questionnaire, cross-tabulated by respondent demographics.

Interpretation of the Means

All the items used in the construction of the explanatory and outcome variables are questions with five-point scales as response options. Some of the response scales used were unipolar; others were bipolar.

Below is an example of a unipolar scale.

Not at all important Not very important Moderately important Very important Extremely important

As the example indicates, a unipolar scale measures the degree to which an attribute or quality is present ("importance," in this example). It has a zero-point at one end, indicating a complete absence of the attribute ("not at all") with the other end indicating the largest amount or presence of the attribute ("extremely"). Unipolar scales were coded such that a value of 1 was assigned to the zero point and a value of 5 was assigned to the largest amount/presence point, with values of 2, 3, and 4 being assigned to the intermediate points. In the example above, "not very" was coded 2, the center of the scale point indicating a moderate amount or presence was coded 3, and "very" was coded 4. Thus, a score close to 1 indicates an absence of the attribute being asked about, a score close to 3 indicates a moderate presence, and a score close to 5 indicates a strong presence.

Below is an example of a bipolar scale. A bipolar scale has two opposing and mutually exclusive poles ("friendly" and "unfriendly," in the example below) and a zero or neutral point in the middle.

Extremely unfriendly Somewhat unfriendly Neither friendly nor unfriendly Somewhat friendly Extremely friendly

Bipolar scales were coded such that a value of 1 was assigned to the pole anchored with a label indicating a negative attribute ("unfriendly," in this example), while a value of 5 was assigned to the opposite pole indicating a positive attribute ("friendly," in this example). A value of 3 was assigned to the zero or neutral point ("neither friendly nor unfriendly," in this example). Thus, the closer the score is to 5, the more positive the response; the closer it is to 1, the more negative the response.

Individual items belonging to the same component are all scored in the same direction. For example, in the student data, one of the explanatory variables is personal identity and belongingness. It is the mean of eleven individual items. One of the items originally was written such that a value of 5 indicates a negative perception: the extent to which the respondent feels isolated. Before computing a component mean, this item was reverse coded so that a high value indicates not at all isolated and a low value means extremely isolated. Similarly, items assessing the frequency of negative experiences which are part of the "negative comments" component —the frequency with which the respondent has personally experienced offensive verbal, visual, or written communications and the frequency of threat of physical assault or actual physical assault—were coded such a high value indicates not at all frequently and a low value means extremely frequently.

In general, throughout the reports, a value close to 5 indicates a positive attitude, experience, or perception, while a value of 1 indicates a negative response.

Significance Tests

The climate survey report includes several graphs and tables that display mean differences in items and components by characteristics of the respondents (e.g., mean overall climate by number of semesters at Oakland). To calculate the means by respondent characteristic, we used the Analysis of Variance procedure

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(ANOVA). The procedure includes options for conducting significance tests for both for the overall model and for specific categories of the explanatory variables. For example, one significance test might tell us that there are statistically significant differences in overall climate by numbers of semester at Oakland. If we want to know which differences between these categories (e.g., at Oakland for 1 to 6 semesters compared to 7 to 10 semesters) are statistically significant, we need to look at a different significance test (referred to as a post hoc test).

While we could display the overall significance test for each model with the tables and graphs in the report and appendices, this would provide no information about the statistical significance of specific differences in the categories of the independent variables. Displaying the information from the post hoc tests would provide this information but would produce messy and difficult-to-read graphs and tables with multiple subscripts and footnotes. Instead, we are providing general information about the margins of error for each stratum of analysis, which readers can use to guide their understanding of the significance of differences evident in the reports.

Although public opinion polls routinely report margins of error for an overall poll (e.g., "this poll has a margin of error of ± -3 "), margins of error are specific to individual items, not entire surveys, and depend on both the variation in the item and the sample size. For example, the margin of error of a yes/no question in which 50% said yes and 50% said no would differ from one in which 90% said yes and 10% said no, holding sample size constant. In order to simplify the reporting, public opinion polls generally report the margin of error that they would get with their sample size if they had a yes/no question in which 50% of the respondents said yes and 50% said no. This provides a conservative estimate of the margin of error without having to report on each specific item.

Table 2 employs the same strategy. The margin of error is what we would get for a yes/no question with a 50/50 split, assuming the sample sizes provided. The larger the sample size, the smaller the margin of error. In the overall student stratum, with 1,734 cases, the margin of error is 2.4%. This means that if a variable measured on a five-point scale has a mean of 3.0, the true value of that variable is 3.0 + /- 2.4%. On a five-point scale, that translates to a 3.0 + /- 0.12. If two means in that stratum differ by 0.13 points or more, then those differences are statistically significant. For example, if male students rated the climate as a 3.0 and female students as a 3.13, that difference would be statistically significant.

Table 2 demonstrates, for each of the three strata, the statistically significant effect size detectable with the attained sample sizes. However, a difference that is statistically significant is not necessarily substantively meaningful. Table 2 shows that the sample size among Oakland students is large enough to state that a difference between a mean of 3.0 and 3.13 is statistically significant, but whether this difference is substantively meaningful is subjective. In general though, if a finding presented in these results is large enough to be substantively interesting, it is also most likely statistically significant.

Small Cell Sizes

In analyzing the climate data by campus and respondent background characteristics, we encountered some instances in which the sample sizes on a particular cross-tabulation were too small to present without potentially identifying the respondent. If a category of a demographic variable (e.g., transgender) included less than 15 respondents, we either suppressed the results for that group or combined it with another, if appropriate. For instance, there were 16 respondents who selected the "transgender" gender category; however, when one takes into account that not all 16 answered all questions on the survey, the cell size for this group for some items was below 15. We did not want to eliminate their views from the analysis, but it was also not appropriate to combine them with male or female categories; therefore, we combined them with respondents who selected "other" or were missing responses to the question on gender into an "other/missing" category.¹ Note, however, that though we will only report results for categories of a demographic that has 15 or more respondents overall, non-response to specific items might reduce this number to less than 15.

Sample Weights

Sample weights are generally constructed for two reasons: to adjust for differential probability of selection of respondents and to correct for minor differences in nonresponse by respondent stratum. Because all faculty, staff, and students on all campuses were invited to participate in the climate survey, they all have the same probability of selection—1.0—and no adjustment is necessary.

On the other hand, the response rates among the different strata varied considerably, from a low of 6.9% among students to a high of 34.7% among staff. If the analysis included all respondents regardless of role, we would need to weight the data to adjust for differential nonresponse. However, in each report we are presenting data on each respondent stratum (i.e., faculty, staff, students) separately and therefore do not need to calculate a weight for this variable because we never combine these strata in the analysis.

Appendices

Appendix A presents the mean ratings on explanatory components not significantly related to overall climate, by various demographic variables. Appendix B presents the results of additional items asked on the questionnaire, but which are not included as part of the explanatory components. Specifically, it presents results for instances of unfair treatment from faculty, staff, or other students and the reasons to which respondents attribute any unfair treatment they might have experienced from faculty, staff, or other students. It also

¹ The 15-respondent cutoff is arbitrary. We chose that number because it is large enough to protect the identity of individual respondents but small enough to minimize the number of categories we collapsed or omitted.

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includes results for sources of any negative events (such as offensive comments or physical assault) personally experienced on campus, and reactions to the same.

As already indicated, Appendix C contains the text of the initial e-mail invitation and reminder messages, and Appendix D contains the questionnaire administered to all students.

Appendixes E through H contain each closed-ended item in the questionnaire cross-tabulated by respondent demographics. The items are presented as follows: items making up the outcome variable are presented first, followed by items making up the explanatory components, in order of the component's strength of association with the outcome variable. Closed-ended items that are not scale questions—and thus are not part of a component—are presented last.

Results

Demographic Profile of Student Respondents

Table 3 below presents the profile of the student respondents with respect to these demographic variables.

Outcome Variable Index and Items

Among student respondents, the outcome variable is the mean of two items that best capture overall climate: (1) overall rating of climate on the campus where the respondent is located and (2) recommendation of the university to other students. Responses to these two items were averaged to create the outcome variable index. Table 4 presents the mean rating on the index and on the individual items comprising the index. Throughout the rest of the report, the outcome variable index will be referred to as **overall climate**.

The mean overall climate rating is 3.9, indicating that students generally have a positive perception of the university. The means for the individual items asking about climate at the campus and willingness to recommend are 4.0 and 3.7, respectively. A value of 4 on the scale used for the first item translates to a "good" rating; for the second item, a value of 3 translates to "moderately strongly" and a value of 4 is "very strongly."

Figures 1 through 8 show the mean values of overall climate by several respondent demographic characteristics. If differences in mean ratings between categories of a demographic characteristic are statistically significant, it is indicated with an '*' at the end of the chart title, and with the p-value displayed in the lower-left of the chart.

Figure 1. Mean Scores on Overall Climate, by Gender: Students



The mean rating on overall climate varies significantly by race, student status, age, and sexual orientation. However, only few of the difference in mean ratings between categories of each demographic are substantive, i.e., different by .3 scale points or more. Overall climate scores are lower

- for those in the African American category than for the other race/ethnicity groups (Figure 2).
- for younger students as compared to older students (Figure 4), and
- for students who identify as "lesbian" as compared to those who identify as belonging to another sexual orientation category (Figure 6).

Figure 6. Mean Scores on Overall Climate, by Sexual Orientation: Students*




Figure 7. Mean Scores on Overall Climate, by Ability/Disability Status: Students





Figure 8. Mean Scores on Overall Climate,



Explanatory Variables and Items

As described in the introduction, the explanatory components (or themes) were constructed using principal components analysis. Table 5 shows the seven components, the individual items that belong to them, and the means for all components and items.

The first component includes eleven items, the majority of which ask about whether the campus environment is friendly, cooperative, or inclusive; feelings of isolation; treatment by other students; and expression of personal identity on campus. Thus, we named the component **belongingness and personal identity**. The question asking about isolation was coded such that a value of 1 means extremely isolated and a value of 5 means not at all isolated. A score was computed for this component by averaging responses to all eleven items. The overall mean on this component is 3.6. The ratings on the individual items range from 3.2 to

4.1; the lowest rating can be seen for the item asking how difficult it is to balance student and family life, while the highest ratings of 4.1 can be seen for the item asking about friendliness of the campus.

The second component listed in Table 5 includes seven items is and called **diversity**. Five of the items ask about satisfaction with the diversity in various places and among various groups on campus; one item asks about treatment of students by administrative support staff, and another asks about how the treatment of minority group students on campus. The overall mean on this component is 3.9. The means on the individual items do not vary much, ranging from 3.7 to 4.1.

The third component also includes seven items, the majority of which ask about issues that might impact the academic environment for students. We named this component **academic support**. A component score was constructed by averaging the responses to all items that comprise it. The mean on this component is 3.9; student ratings of the academic support they get are above the midpoint. Of the individual items comprising this component, the highest rating is evident for being treated well by faculty and instructors (mean = 4.2). The lowest rating is on the item asking about how active faculty and instructors are in empowering students to learn (mean = 3.7).

The next component is **access to services** and includes nine items, seven of which ask about ease of access to various resources on campus such as academic advising, financial aid, etc. The two with the highest rating — (4.2— ask about ease of access to computer equipment/technology and about how the academic advising staff treats students. The item with the lowest ranking—3.0—is for ease of getting something done when it involves multiple units or offices on campus having to work together.

The next component is labeled **physical threats to self** because the two items it includes ask about the frequency of students' personal experiences of physical assaults and threats of violence. Both items in this table have been coded such that ratings close to 1 indicate a high frequency of such behavior and ratings close to 5 indicate a low frequency of such behavior (Extremely often = 1, Very often = 2, Moderately often = 3, Not very often = 4, Never = 5). The mean rating of 4.9 on the overall component makes it the component with the highest mean rating, indicating that students almost never experience these types of threats. The ratings for the individual items are the same—both 4.9.

The second to last component is labeled **physical threats to other** because the two items it includes ask about the frequency of students' hearsay experiences of physical assaults and threats of violence to others. These items were also both coded such that 1=Extremely often and 5=Never. The overall component mean rating of 4.6 makes it the component with the second highest mean rating, indicating that students have rarely seen or heard of others having these types of experiences. The ratings for the two individual items are both 4.6.

The final component is **negative comments**. The component includes ratings of the frequency of personal experiences or hearsay experiences of offensive images, verbal comments, or written comments. Again, all items in this component were coded such that 1=Extremely often and 5=Never. The overall rating on this component is 4.5 indicating a very low frequency of such experiences; it has the third highest rating of all components.

After computing the components, we conducted a regression analysis in which the outcome variable—overall climate—was regressed on the seven explanatory components. Table 6 presents the standardized regression coefficients for each explanatory variable. As mentioned earlier, coefficients can range from -1.0 to 1.0. The sign of the coefficient indicates the direction of the relationship: a negative coefficient indicates that the outcome variable and the explanatory variable are inversely related—as one increases, the other decreases; a positive coefficient means that as one variable increases so does the other. Six of the seven coefficients are positive. The size of the coefficient indicates the strength of the relationship: the closer the correlation is to -1.0 or 1.0, the stronger the relationship. In Table 6, the explanatory variables are presented in order of the strength of their relationship with the outcome variable.

The component **belongingness and personal identity** has the highest coefficient with overall climate—0.51. This indicates that the more positively students rate this component, the higher they rate the overall climate.

The next largest explanatory components is **diversity**. The final two explanatory components or items shown in Table 6—academic support and access to services—are both significantly related with overall climate; however much less strongly than belongingness and personal identity, and diversity.

The three other explanatory variables—physical threats to self, physical threats to others, and negative comments—are not significantly associated with the outcome variable. That is, scores on these components do not significantly affect the outcome variable.

Prioritizing Areas for Action

We have used the results of the regression analysis shown in Table 6 and the mean ratings on the components and the individual items shown in Table 5 to identify primary and secondary areas of strength and primary and secondary areas for action for students at Oakland University.

Primary versus secondary areas of focus

The results of the regression analysis can be used to define which issues can be tagged as primary or secondary. Three components that have the strongest relationship with overall climate—belongingness and personal identity and diversity—can be tagged as primary areas because affecting scores on these two components will greatly affect scores on overall climate. The other two components—academic support and access to services are tagged as secondary areas because while they are significantly related to overall climate, changes in the scores on these two components have a relatively smaller effect on overall climate scores.

Strengths versus areas for action

The mean ratings of the components and the individual items can be used to define which issues can be tagged as strengths and which ones as areas for action. Components or items for which the mean rating is at least half a scale point above the mean of 3 on a 5-point scale or higher—that is, above 3.5—can be considered as areas of strength and components or items for which the mean rating is at or below 3.5 can be considered as areas on which action needs to be taken. Please note that this cut-off point has been arbitrarily chosen for the reasons outlined above; the bar can be set higher or lower as desired.

Identifying strengths and prioritizing areas for action

Table 7 below presents the explanatory components delineated as primary or secondary and as strengths or areas for action. The cells in the top half represent primary areas, and the cells in the bottom half of the table represent secondary areas. The cells on the left represent areas of strength, and the cells on the right represent areas for action. Thus, components in the top left cell include those that have a strong relationship with overall climate and that students rated higher/more positively. These are strength areas for Oakland University with respect to students. Components in the top right cell include those that have a strong relationship with overall climate and that students rated relatively lower/more negatively. These are areas on which Oakland University could consider taking action, with respect to students.


Components in the bottom left are those that have a relatively weaker relationship with overall climate and that students rated relatively high/positively. These are strong areas for Oakland University but not as effectual in altering perceptions of overall climate. Components in the bottom right cell have a relatively weaker

relationship with overall climate and students provided a relatively low/negative rating to these. These are areas of concern for Oakland University but perhaps not as critical as ones in the top right cell.

Tables 8, 9, 10, and 11 provide the same type of analysis but for individual items within each of the components presented in Table 7. Areas of strength and weakness are identified in the same way as for the explanatory components. To classify an item as primary or secondary, we use the factor loading of that item within the component to which it belongs; items with factor loadings of .5 and above are tagged as primary areas, and items with factor loadings from 0 to .49 .50 are classified as secondary.

Areas of Strength and Action by Component

Belongingness and Personal Identity

This component has the strongest relationship with overall climate, and the average rating of all individual items in this component is 3.6, which makes it an area of strength for Oakland University as it is a primary component on which the mean score is higher than 3.5.

Table 8 provides the priority performance grid for individual items within this component. Areas of strength and weakness are identified in the same way as for the overall component, and primary and secondary areas are identified based on factor loadings of .5 or greater versus those below .5.



Figures 9 to 16 shows the mean scores on the belongingness and personal identity component by various demographic variables. As earlier, and throughout the main report, if differences in mean ratings between categories of a demographic characteristic are statistically significant, it is indicated with an '*' following the chart title, and with the p-value displayed in the lower-left of the chart.

The mean rating on the "belongingness and personal identity" component varies significantly by all but one of the demographic variables presented in Figures 9 to 16. However, only few of these difference are substantive, i.e., different by .3 scale points or more, and these will be highlighted.

Mean ratings are lower among those in the "other or missing" gender category (3.3), as compared to males and females (3.7 and 3.6 respectively; see Figure 8). And, mean ratings are significantly lower for those in the "other or multiracial" category as compared to those who identify as "White" (Figure 9).

Figure 12. Mean Scores on Belongingness and Personal Identity, by Age: Students*





Figure 13. Mean on Belongingness and Personal **Identity by Semesters Enrolled at University:**

Figure 14. Mean Scores on Belongingness and Personal Identity, by Sexual **Orientation: Students***




Figure 15. Mean Scores on Belongingness and Personal Identity by Ability/Disability Status:




Figure 16. Mean Scores on Belongingness and

The mean rating is highest among the straight/heterosexual category (Figure 13). The difference in ratings on this component between this category and the "lesbian" and the "queer or other" categories is significant (Figure 14).

Additional questions not part of the component. Follow-up questions were asked of one item in this explanatory factor, in an attempt to better understand the reasons for the ratings respondents provided. As a follow up to the question asking about level of comfort with expressing personal identity, the 154 students (9%) who indicated that they were "Not very comfortable," or "Not at all comfortable," were asked about the reasons why they felt this way.

Table 8.1 shows the distribution of responses to this follow up question. Note that respondents could select as many reasons as applicable; therefore, the percentages in the table will sum to greater than 100%. Fear of negative consequences, harassment, or discrimination is the reason endorsed by the highest percentage (68.8%) among the 154 respondents.

Diversity

This component has the second strongest relationship with overall climate, and the average rating of all individual items in this component is 3.9, which makes it an area of strength for Oakland University as it is a primary component on which the mean score is higher than 3.5.

Table 9 provides the priority performance grid for individual items within this component. Areas of strength and weakness are identified in the same way as for the overall component, and primary and secondary areas are identified based on factor loadings of .5 or greater versus those below .5.


Figures 17 to 24 show the mean scores on the "diversity" component by various demographic variables. As for the previous component, substantive differences of .3 scale points or higher will be highlighted.

The mean rating on this component is significantly lower among those in the "other or missing" gender category (3.6) compared to males and females (4.0 and 3.9 respectively; see Figure 17).

Figure 20. Mean Scores on Diversity, by Age: Students




Figure 22. Mean Scores on Diversity, by Sexual Orientation: Students*




Figure 24. Mean Scores on Diversity, by Religion: Students




Figure 21. Mean Scores on Diversity, by Semesters Enrolled at University: Students





Figure 23. Mean Scores on Diversity, by Ability/Disability Status: Students*

The mean rating is lowest among the lesbian and queer or other sexual orientation categories as compared to other groups in this category (Figure 22).

Mean ratings on this component do not vary significantly by student status (Figure 19), age (Figure 20), by number of semesters enrolled at the university (Figure 21), or by religion (Figure 24).

Academic Support

This component has the third strongest relationship with overall climate. The average rating of all individual items in this component is 3.9, which makes it an area of strength for Oakland University. As the strength of the relationship is lower as compared to the first two components, it has been classified as a secondary area in terms of priority.

Table 10 provides the priority-performance grid for individual items within this component. Areas of strength and weakness, and primary and secondary areas are identified in the same way as for the previous two explanatory components.





Figures 25 to 32 shows the mean scores on the academic support component by various demographic variables.

The mean ratings on the "Academic support" component are not significantly different based on gender categories (Figure 21), or race/ethnicity categories (Figure 23).

The mean rating given by undergraduate students is 3.8, and is lower than that given by graduate/professional students—4.1—on this component (Figure 24).

Figure 28. Mean Scores on Academic Support, by Age: Students*





Figure 29. Mean Scores on Academic Support, by Semesters Enrolled at University: Students

Figure 30. Mean Scores on Academic Support, by Sexual Orientation: Students*




Figure 31. Mean Scores on Academic Support, by Ability/Disability Status: Students





Figure 32. Mean Scores on Academic Support,



Mean ratings on this component are significantly lower for the youngest age group (mean=3.8) as compared to students in the oldest age group, with a mean of 4.1 (Figure 28). Mean ratings are highest for those who identify as 'gay' (mean rating=4.2) and lower for those in the 'lesbian' and 'queer and other' categories (Figure 30).

Additional questions not part of the component.

Two other items on the questionnaire, which are not part of the component, provide additional related information. The majority of student respondents—

76.4%—indicated that there was someone at the university who gives them advice on academic issues and/or advocates for them. Further, 81.3% felt that it is *extremely* or *very important* to have someone like this (mean rating of 4.3 on a scale ranging from 1 = not at all important to 5 = extremely important).

Access to Services

This is the final component with a significant relationship with overall climate; however, as the strength of the relationship is low as compared to the first two components, it has been classified as a secondary area in terms of priority. The average rating of all individual items in this component is 3.7, which makes it area of strength for Oakland University.

Table 11 provides the priority-performance grid for individual items within this component. Areas of strength and weakness are identified in the same way as for the overall component.



Figures 33 to 40 shows the mean scores on the access to services component by various demographic variables.

The mean rating on this component is significantly lower among those in the "other or missing" gender category (3.4), as compared to males and females (3.8 and 3.7, respectively; see Figure 33).

There are no significant differences in the mean rating by race/ethnicity (Figure 34) or by student status (Figure 35).



Mean ratings on this component do not vary substantively by age (Figure 36) nor by number of semesters enrolled at the university (Figure 37).

The mean rating is highest among the straight/heterosexual category and lowest among those in the lesbian category (Figure 38). Finally, students who indicate that they have some disability who did not respond to the question about religion have a significantly lower mean rating on this component as compared to students who indicate they are Christian (Figure 40).

Comparison with Scores from 2013 Survey




Figure 41 shows the change in overall climate ratings between the survey conducted in 2013 and now. As is evident, the overall climate ratings have gone up from 3.7 in 2013 to 3.9 in 2017. The difference between these ratings is significant at the p<.01 level.




Figure 42. Mean Scores on Significant Explanatory Components, by Year of Survey: Students

Figure 42 shows the change in ratings of the overall explanatory components between the survey conducted in 2013 and now. Scores on all but one component have gone up slightly. Belongingness and Personal Identity, the strongest explanatory

component, is the only one for which scores have not increased in the 2017 survey as compared to the 2013 survey; scores on this component have remained unchanged.

Summary of Results

In summary, these analyses derived an outcome variable termed "overall climate"—the mean rating on which is 3.9 (on a 5-point scale)—and sought to examine factors or aspects of the climate that influence the overall climate rating. To do so, seven explanatory components were identified based on the principal components analyses done for the 2013 study: Belongingness and Personal Identity; Diversity; Academic Support; Access to Services; Physical Threats to Self; Physical Threats to Others and Negative Comments. Of these explanatory variables, all but the last three (Physical Threats to Self, Physical Threats to Others and Negative Comments) significantly influence ratings on overall climate.

All four explanatory components significantly related to overall climate have a mean score greater than 3.5, making them all areas of strength for Oakland University

2017 Oakland University Climate Survey: Students

Ratings on *belongingness and personal identity* range from 3.5 to 4.0 across all demographic groups. The lowest ratings on this component can be seen among those in the "other or missing" gender category, those in the "other or multiracial" and "African American race/ethnicity categories, those in the "lesbian" and the "queer or other" sexual orientation categories, those with some type of disability, and those who did not respond to the question about religion.

Ratings on diversity range from 3.0 to 3.6. Again, ratings are lowest among those in the "other or missing" gender category, those in the "African American race/ethnicity category, and those in the "lesbian" and the "queer or other" sexual orientation categories.




Figure A1. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Gender:

^{**} Difference in means significant at the p<.01 level




Figure A2. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Race/Ethnicity: Students




Figure A3. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Student Status: Students




Figure A4. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Age: Students




Figure A5. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Semesters Enrolled at University: Students




Figure A6. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Sexual Orientation: Students




Figure A7. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Ability/Disability Status: Students




Figure A7. Mean Scores on Components Not Significantly Related to Overall Climate, by Religion: Students

There were two other items on the questionnaire, not presented in the main body of the report, but which provide additional information about the issue of unfair treatment. When asked, "As far as you know, are there units or offices in place to help students if they are treated unfairly, or are there no such units or offices?," 76.5% (n=1,323) respondents indicated that there were such units or office and 23.5% (n=406) indicated that there were no such units or offices.

The 1,323 respondents who knew of such units or offices were asked, "How effective are these units or offices in addressing issues of treatment that are not fair and equitable?" The majority (61.7%) indicated that they did not have enough information to say. Of the remaining 506 respondents, 53.1% selected *extremely* or *very effective*, 9.9% selected *not at all* or *not very effective* (mean rating of 3.6, on a scale ranging from 1=not at all effective to 5=extremely effective).

As follow ups to the items asking about personal experiences of offensive verbal comments, offensive written

comments, offensive verbal comments, threats of physical violence, and or physical assaults or injuries, respondents who selected "Moderately often, "Very often," or "Extremely often," to one or more of these were asked about the source of the treatment and their reactions to the treatment. As these are both 'select all that apply' items, responses will sum to greater than 100%. As Table B3 shows, other students were selected most often as the sources of such experiences. HR facilitators were selected least often.

Further, as Table B4 indicates, the most common respondent reactions to experiencing offensive comments and/or threats of or actual physical violence is to do nothing. Thirty-seven percent indicated that they did nothing because they are used to such treatment, 36.8% did not know what to do, and 22% indicated that they did nothing, that is, they did not complain, because they feared that their complaint would not be taken seriously.
