ZA to ZS Option

Early Childhood General and Special Education ("ZS") Endorsement

Option Overview:

This 2-course sequence was created for educators who previously earned the ZA (Early Childhood) endorsement and who would like to upgrade to the newer, more inclusive ZS (Early Childhood General and Special Education) endorsement.

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) also requires candidates to pass the **Early Childhood Education: General and Special Education MTTC** test (Code #106 / ZS) in order to receive the ZS endorsement.

Individuals who earn the ZS credential will:

- meet MDE's revised standards reflecting the knowledge and skills needed to teach children from birth to age 8 in general education settings, as well as significant knowledge and skills for teaching children with disabilities
- become qualified to teach in:
 - general education early childhood classrooms
 - inclusive early childhood classrooms, and
 - > early childhood special education classrooms
- ➤ have earned the most up-to-date early childhood endorsement available, as well as the skills and knowledge needed to address the developmental and educational needs of all children, regardless of ability level.

Eligibility

Candidates must have a Michigan teaching certificate with a ZA endorsement. Qualifications will be reviewed by the program coordinator prior to registration.

Location

These two courses are offered through Oakland University at the Macomb University Center (MUC) in Clinton Township, Michigan.

ZA to ZS Option Catalog Course Descriptions

Early Childhood General and Special Education Endorsement

These courses are offered at:

Macomb University Center (MUC) 44575 Garfield Road Clinton Township, MI 48038

EC 552 Introduction to Early Childhood Special Education (4 credits)

This course focuses on Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) as a unique discipline similar to, but distinctly different than early childhood education and special education. Teaming, assessment, family-centered practice and child focused practices within multiple contexts of ECSE will be addressed. Activities including field experiences will take place that encourage reflective practice. (This course is offered fall term only.)

EC 553

Early Childhood Special Education: Programming, Planning and Intervention (4 credits)

This course focuses on linking the foundational components to professional practice in the field of Early Childhood Special Education. Practical applications of teaming, assessment, family centered practice and child focused approaches will be addressed, with particular attention to the themes of diversity, inclusion, and technology. Field experiences are built into the course. (This course is offered winter term only.)

HOW TO APPLY

ZA to ZS Endorsement Option

Because upgrading from a ZA to a ZS endorsement requires the completion of only two courses (and not a complete "degree program"), individuals interested will apply for "Professional Development" student status.

- Students admitted to *Professional Development* classification are not eligible to receive financial assistance.
- Admission as a Professional Development student in no way assures subsequent admission to a degree or graduate certificate program.

On the Planned Course of Study page, please select "Professional Development – Education" and list the course(s) you wish to register for (EC 552 and EC 553)

Syllabus	The instructor will provide the syllabus and course schedule online (via Moodle) or at the first class meeting. If you have questions regarding the course prior to the class starting, please contact the instructor directly.
