The Resident as Teachers (RAT) Program provides residents and fellows exposure to medical teaching concepts and opportunities to improve teaching skills through didactic presentations, review of taped case scenarios, role-play, and other activities. Residents as Teachers is based on a curriculum that was developed by Kelley Skeff, M.D., Ph.D. at the Stanford University Faculty Development Center. Upon successful completion of the course, graduates will receive a framed **Certificate of Advanced Training in Medical Education** with appropriate mention in subsequent letters of recommendation.
