

- » Overseeing the philosophy and regulations on which <u>faculty governance</u> is based in compliance with the standards set forth by the Liaison Committee for Medical Education (LCME).

# OUWB Committees and Faculty Assembly Leadership

### **Admissions Interviewers**

Interview student applicants of the OUWB. One annual training session is required. Interviewers are asked to interview at least four or five interview days out of 20. Interviews take place on most Fridays and some Thursdays between late August and early March.

## **Application Screeners**

Read application files to help determine which applicants should receive interviews. Applications are online accessible. Application screeners must attend an annual training session and screen five applications every week or every other week from late June through February.
