Good academic standing is the designation given when a student has either received Pass, Pass with Remediation, High Pass, or Honors in all coursework. Any unremediated Fail on a student record in any academic year or being placed on Probation or Suspension by the SPRC will remove a student from good academic standing.	
Procedures:	
Students must request a verification of Good Academic Standing from the Director of School of Medicine Records and Registration.
