"I currently serve as the Assistant to the City Manager with the City of Troy, where I work directly with senior staff to help implement policies and programs for a community of more than 80,000 people. I couldn't be more thrilled about the opportunity to have a direct impact on my community, and the MPA program allowed me to not only find a career, but a passion. Prior to my time in Troy, I worked with the Village of Oxford and their Downtown Development Authority, and interned with the City of Rochester; all opportunities that wouldn't have been possible if it weren't for the connections

and knowledge I found at Oakland University.

The faculty and staff helped me not only learn the key concepts I needed to hit the ground running professionally, but also connected me to people and opportunities that will help shape my career for years to come. I was able to immediately apply my coursework to my professional career, while learning alongside a network of classmates and instructors who are also passionate about public service and making a difference in their communities. During and after my time in the program I've had the chance to work on City-wide projects and programs, design strategic plans, assist with the development of multi-million dollar budgets, and develop leadership skills that have opened new and fulfilling doors in my career.
