Business Requirements

*Follow one math pathway. MTH 1221 & 1222 or MTH 1441 & 1554.

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from Henry Ford, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their Henry Ford academic adviser to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

TRANSFERRING WITH THE MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA):

When choosing to complete MTA to satisfy General Education, please confirm the best courses to take to fulfill the agreement with your academic adviser at Henry Ford or at the <u>Henry Ford MTA Approved Courses</u> website. Completing MTA when following this major guide will satisfy OU's transferrable General Education requirements.

HFC and OU currently have an <u>articulation agreement</u> that allows students to transfer in more credits than usual. Meet with an HFC academic adviser to learn more about this opportunity.

Students must have a minimum cumulative transfer GPA of 2.8 and have completed at least intermediate algebra in order to be admitted to OU as a pre-business major.

Math prerequisites: MATH 080 or (MATH 1091, 1092, 1093 and 1094) = MTH 0661 at OU, MATH 110 = MTH 0662 at OU
