## ^Students who are pursuing a Business major at OU must complete LEGL 215 prior to attending OU. Students

who are already enrolled at OU must take MGT 3500 at OU, and cannot transfer the equivalent from Lansing.

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from Lansing, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, <u>it is</u> <u>highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their Lansing academic adviser</u> to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

### TRANSFERRING WITH THE MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA):

When choosing to complete MTA to satisfy General Education, please confirm the best courses to take to fulfill the agreement with your academic adviser at Lansing or at the Lansing MTA Approved Courses website. Completing MTA when following this major guide will satisfy OU's transferrable General Education requirements.

### **TRANSFERRING WITHOUT MTA:**

If you intend to transfer without MTA, you can choose to complete additional coursework to fulfill OU's individual General Education categories instead.
