- 5. Mechanical Engineering Combined BSE/MS (Updated) Proposal for a new combined program to retain top undergraduate students at Oakland University and bolter the department's research productivity; Department of Mechanical Engineering, School of Computer Science and Engineering Sarah Beetham
 - Revisions suggested by Grad Council
 - 12 credits from MS to BSE requirements have been rearranged and more stringently specified
 - One theory course (APM 5441 or ME 5400)
 - Master's Thesis Research (8 total / 4 in undergrad period) (ME 6998)
 - A 5000 level ME course of the student's choosing
 - Simultaneous changes to MS
 - Change in Tech electives in Master's program
 - Combined program needs the same requirements as the MS program requirements
 - Staying within the requirements of the grad program
 - COMMENT: Grad is currently reviewing a policy that will address 6000-level courses. Currently, undergraduate students can only take up to 5000 level courses. ME 6998 can't be included in the combined degree program as a requirement for undergrads.
 - COMMENT: Is there the possibility of developing a 5000 level course change 6998 course (thesis) be changed to 5998 (solves the issue of the policy not yet in place)
 - REPONSE: There is still a need for the grad research credits and having them in the program encourages students to take the research route

9. The General Education Committee proposal to amend the Policy for International Second Degree Seeking Students to remove general education

requirements; University Senate General Education Committee - Adolfo Campoy-Cubillo and Adina Schneeweis

- Committee reviewing the policy based on the high number of students seeking Petition of Exceptions
- This change in policy applies to domestic and international students seeking second degrees
- GEC has received feedback from students to also consider that students educated outside the US must still complete the US Diversity requirement and has added additional language based on the Senate Steering Committee
- GEC Committee seeking feedback
- COMMENT: If OU is still requiring a diversity course, the language should read "modification" of the policy language should be concise
- COMMENT: Support for change in policy would help make OU more competitive since GVSU and Wayne State Univ have this in place / support for first
- COMMENT: Support for removing the US Diversity course
- UCUI voting on the original language proposal (without the Diversity)
