English Proficiency Policy

- Rosemary Max, Executive Director, Global Engagement presented the changes to the
 english proficiency policy. She mentioned that the new policy added two new test PTE
 Academic and Duolingo. These new test gives flexibility to the student with respect to
 scheduling. Developing a pathway program to undergraduate and graduate students that
 helps the students to take the ESL courses depending on their test scores.

- A. Stop-Out Policy
- Tricia Westergaard, Registrar presented the new recommendation is to change the currently 6-year stop-out policy to 2 years. She also presented the stop out policy from other universities in Michigan. If the new policy is successful then she mentioned that this could be potentially changed to 1 year.
- Ami Harbin moved the motion and Cristian Cantir seconded. The new stop-out policy is unanimously approved by the members of UCUI
- B. Proposed Policy on Exams during Finals Week (Deferred 11-15-2018)

New Program – BS in Nutrition, SHS

- A. BS in Nutrition proposal: There is currently a concentration in nutrition and a minor. The concentration is not accredited by The Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ASCEND). The plan is to get Bachelor get accredited by ASCEND and then get M.S. in Registered Dietician.
 - Discussion (questions underlined):
 - Robert Sidelinger: P 11, Year 2 winter credit is listed as 16 credits but the total comes out to only 14 credits. P 11, Year 4 winter credit is listed as 13 credit but should be listed as 13-15 credits. is it possible to provide clarification of this?
 - Departmental letters of supports are forthcoming. The committee would like to see community letters of support.
 - Robert Sidelinger: is it possible to provide evidence (e.g., a survey of students?)
 - Sarah Newton: P 11, Year 3 in fall, 2000 level courses and the courses are not sequential. is it possible to provide clarification of this?
 - Robert Sidelinger: Tenure-track four faculty positions (4): <u>Do they need all at</u> once or need overtime?

- Sarah Newton: Space for lab? They will be working with outside locations and Chartwells
- Deb McGinnis: There might be three programs: Epidemiology (Nutrition and health), Food science and Counciling (Specfic need for health). There is a toally a need for this program.
