Anthropology

To provide an understanding of the human experience, from physiology and evolutionary origins as well as the social and cultural organization of human societies. 20 Credits

Archeology

To provide a richer understanding of past human life and activities through the scientific study of material remains such as fossil relics, artifacts, and monuments. 28 Credits

Criminal Justice

To develop a richer understanding of the study of the theory of criminology and victimization offenders by the criminal justice system. 28 Credits

Economics

To develop a richer understanding of how economic analysis applies to major problems facing individuals, businesses, the nation and the world. 18 Credits

International Relations

To provide a richer understanding of the relationships between countries, including the roles of states, inter-governmental organizations, multinational corporations. 22 Credits + 1 year language

Philosophy

To develop analysis and evaluation of the basic assumptions and inferences made when forming arguments, particularly about reality, truth, knowledge, reasoning, human nature. 20 Credits

Political Science

To provide a richer understanding of the study of the state, government, and the theory and practice of politics. 20 Credits

Psychology

To provide a richer understanding of the human mind, psychological processes, and human development as well as the study of social behavior and the development and organization of personality. 24 Credits

Public Administration

To develop leadership and analytical skills, ethics, accountability, diversity and responsiveness of current and aspiring public and non-governmental executives. 20 Credits

Sociology

To provide a richer understanding of the study of society and the cultural and social factors that shape individual and group behavior. 20 Credits

Women and Gender Studies

To provide a richer understanding of the systems of gender, power, and representation that shape the lives of women and men, girls and boys. 20 Credits
