## **MAJOR COURSE REQUIREMENTS 2009/2010**

A minimum grade of 2.0 is required for each course in each major. Freshmen pre-business and undecided business students admitted under this catalog year are not eligible to take any 300- or 400-level SBA courses without major standing in the business school.
