WHEREAS, Mathew James Seidel entered Oakland University as a student from Clonara School in Ann Arbor, MI to pursue a major in Liberal Studies with a minor in Biology in the College of Arts Sciences; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Seidel demonstrated academic excellence by maintaining a 4.0 grade point average while serving as an undergraduate Research Assistant in the Eye Research Institute, participating in the SUPER program, contributing to peer-reviewed scientific manuscripts, including first-author work under review, presenting research at local, national, and international conferences, and earning a Provost Undergraduate Student Research Award; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Seidel demonstrated distinguished campus leadership by serving as the Student Liaison to the Oakland University Board of Trustees, founding and leading the Michigan Coalition for Human Rights Oakland University Chapter, serving as Chair of the Student Life Lecture Board where he successfully planned and executed a large-scale campus lecture reaching over 1,000 attendees, and founding the Provost's Student Advisory Council to advance student voice in institutional decision-making; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Seidel dedicated himself to sustained service and mentorship by volunteering for nearly a decade with South Oakland Citizens for the Homeless, mentoring students as a Supplemental Instruction Leader, and advancing education, advocacy, and community engagement through both campus and community-based initiatives; and
