## NOTES:

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from Bay, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their Bay academic adviser to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.8 in order to be admitted to major standing in Early Childhood Education. Students with a GPA of 2.5 will be considered for admission to OU.

## **TALKING POINTS**:

The Early Childhood Education program prepares students to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Early Childhood Education and recommendation for a Michigan Teaching Certificate.

Passing scores on Michigan <u>Tests for Teacher Certification</u> (MTTC) are required for Michigan Teaching Certification. Learn more about <u>Educator Certification</u>, which OU graduates complete after their student teaching and receiving passing MTTC scores.

Early Childhood Education students complete <u>field experiences</u> with early childhood general and special education students in preschools, home visits, and other early intervention settings. Student teaching is in an inclusive or early childhood special education preschool.
