#### NOTES:

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from Henry Ford, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their Henry Ford academic adviser to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.8 in order to be admitted to major standing in Elementary Education. Students with a GPA of 2.5 will be considered for admission to OU.

## **TALKING POINTS**:

The Elementary Education program prepares students to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education <u>and</u> recommendation for a Michigan Teaching Certificate.

Passing scores on Michigan <u>Tests for Teacher Certification</u> (MTTC) are required for Michigan Teaching Certification. Learn more about <u>Educator Certification</u>, which OU graduates complete after their student teaching and receiving passing MTTC scores.

Elementary Education students complete <u>field experiences</u> in local elementary schools while they are in their professional education classes. Students will experience breadth, depth, and diversity of grade levels and communities in their field placements.
