NOTES:

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from NMC, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, <u>it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their NMC academic adviser to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements</u>.

Students must have a minimum GPA of 2.8 in order to be admitted to major standing in Elementary Education. Students with a GPA of 2.5 will be considered for admission to OU.

TALKING POINTS:

The Elementary Education program prepares students to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education <u>and</u> recommendation for a Michigan Teaching Certificate.

Passing scores on Michigan <u>Tests for Teacher Certification</u> (MTTC) are required for Michigan Teaching Certification. Learn more about <u>Educator Certification</u>, which OU graduates complete after their student teaching and receiving passing MTTC scores.

Elementary Education students complete <u>field experiences</u> in local elementary schools while they are in their professional education classes. Students will experience breadth, depth, and diversity of grade levels and communities in their field placements.
