

Bachelor of Science in Applied Health Sciences

Have already completed the course requirements for and earned the Associate of Applied Science degree in a health-related field from an accredited community college or other institution of higher education:

• Students who hold an AAS degree in another field must seek permission to enroll from the Applied Health Sciences Program Coordinator.

Submit official transcripts showing AAS degree and all coursework completed with a minimum 2.0 GPA. Concurrent enrollment in a community college AAS program and Oakland University's AHS program is <u>not</u> permitted.

There are four concentrations within this major program: <u>Health Care Leadership</u>, <u>Health Promotion</u>, <u>Orthotics and Prosthetics Assistant Studies</u>, or <u>Radiologic Technology Leadership</u>. More details about course requirements can be found in the <u>catalog</u>.

TRANSFERRING WITH THE MICHIGAN TRANSFER AGREEMENT (MTA):

When choosing to complete MTA to satisfy General Education, please confirm the best courses to take to fulfill the agreement with your counselor at OCC or at the OCC MTA Approved Courses website. In order to completely satisfy OU's transferable General Education requirements when following this major guide, please reference the OCC General Education Transfer Guide and complete the courses that satisfy the following requirements:

- Writing Foundations (take ENG 1520)
- Knowledge Applications (can also be satisfied by completing the Health Care Leadership Track at OU)

TRANSFERRING WITHOUT MTA:

If you intend to transfer without MTA, you can choose to complete additional coursework to fulfill OU's individual General Education categories instead. When following this major guide, please reference the OCC General Education Transfer Guide for the OCC courses that satisfy these specific OU General Education categories:

- Writing Foundations (take ENG 1520)
- Formal Reasoning
- Arts
- Language and Culture
- Global Perspective
- Literature
- Western Civilization
- Knowledge Applications (can also be satisfied by completing the Health Care Leadership Track at OU)

OCC and OU currently have articulation agreements for <u>Radiologic Technology Leadership</u> and <u>other tracks</u> that allows students to transfer in more credits than usual. Meet with an OCC counselor to learn more about these opportunities.

NOTES:

Students may transfer an unlimited amount of credit from OCC, and must complete a minimum of 45 credit hours from OU to meet degree requirements. As programs may limit how much transfer credit can be used toward requirements, it is highly recommended that students work with both an OU academic adviser and their OCC counselor to maximize the applicability of coursework to specific requirements.

Oakland University will always honor the **MACRAO transfer agreement** and apply it to the General Education requirement the same as MTA.
