## GROUP VISITS

Oakland University Undergraduate Admissions is pleased to host campus visits geared toward college-bound students, educational organizations, and other special visitors. Rather than attend one of our daily campus tours, Discover OU or Saturday Campus Tour programs, we suggest that large groups set up a separate visit. The Undergraduate Admissions Office can accommodate group visits on select **Monday** or **Wednesday** mornings at 9:30 a.m. Group visits are not offered on any other day or on weekends.

To schedule your group visit, please fill out a **Group Visit Request Form** and fax completed form to GROUP VISIT at (248) 370-2186. You may also send the requested information via email to [visit@oakland.edu](mailto:visit@oakland.edu). For further inquiries, please call directly at (248)370-4556.

Groups planning to visit Oakland University should follow these guidelines:

- Your **Group Visit Request Form** must be received at least 2-3 weeks in advance
- Students must be in Grades 8-12
- Groups must provide at least 1 chaperone for every 10 students
- Chaperones must remain with students throughout the visit
- Maximum group size is 50 plus chaperones
- Groups should arrive no later than 9:15 a.m.

### **Arrival on Campus - 9:15 a.m.**

Oakland University is located in southeastern Michigan between Flint and Detroit. Take I-75 to exit 79 and go east on University Drive to the main entrance of the campus. Follow the circle drive and take the second right, which is Meadow Brook Road. Turn right onto Wilson Blvd and follow to end. Unload your bus here. The bus may park in parking lot 3 (P3 or the overflow lot) for the duration of your visit. ### **Admissions Welcome - 9:30 a.m.**

An experienced Admissions Adviser will welcome your group to campus, share Oakland University's video presentation, and briefly discuss admissions criteria, majors offered, financial aid, campus housing, student life, and more. If your group would like to meet with a specific academic department, those arrangements would need to be made directly with the appropriate departmental contact person.

### **Walking Tour - 10:00 a.m.- 11:00 a.m.**

Led by a current Oakland University student ambassador, the 1 hour walking tour takes visitors in and around some of the most popular locations on campus including the Oakland Center, Recreation Center, residence halls, Kresge Library and selected academic buildings. This tour requires extensive walking, so visitors are encouraged to wear comfortable shoes and to prepare in advance for seasonal weather conditions. If anyone in your party requires disability accommodations, please indicate your specific needs on the **Group Visit Request Form**.

### **Optional Lunch - 11:00 a.m.- 12:00 p.m.**

Staying on campus for lunch is optional for your group. Students may bring their own sack lunch or buy lunch at the Pioneer Food Court (approximately \$8.00 plus tax per person). Students may pay for their lunch individually, or chaperones may pay the total for all students with one check made payable to Chartwell's Dining Services. Money orders and credit cards are not accepted.
